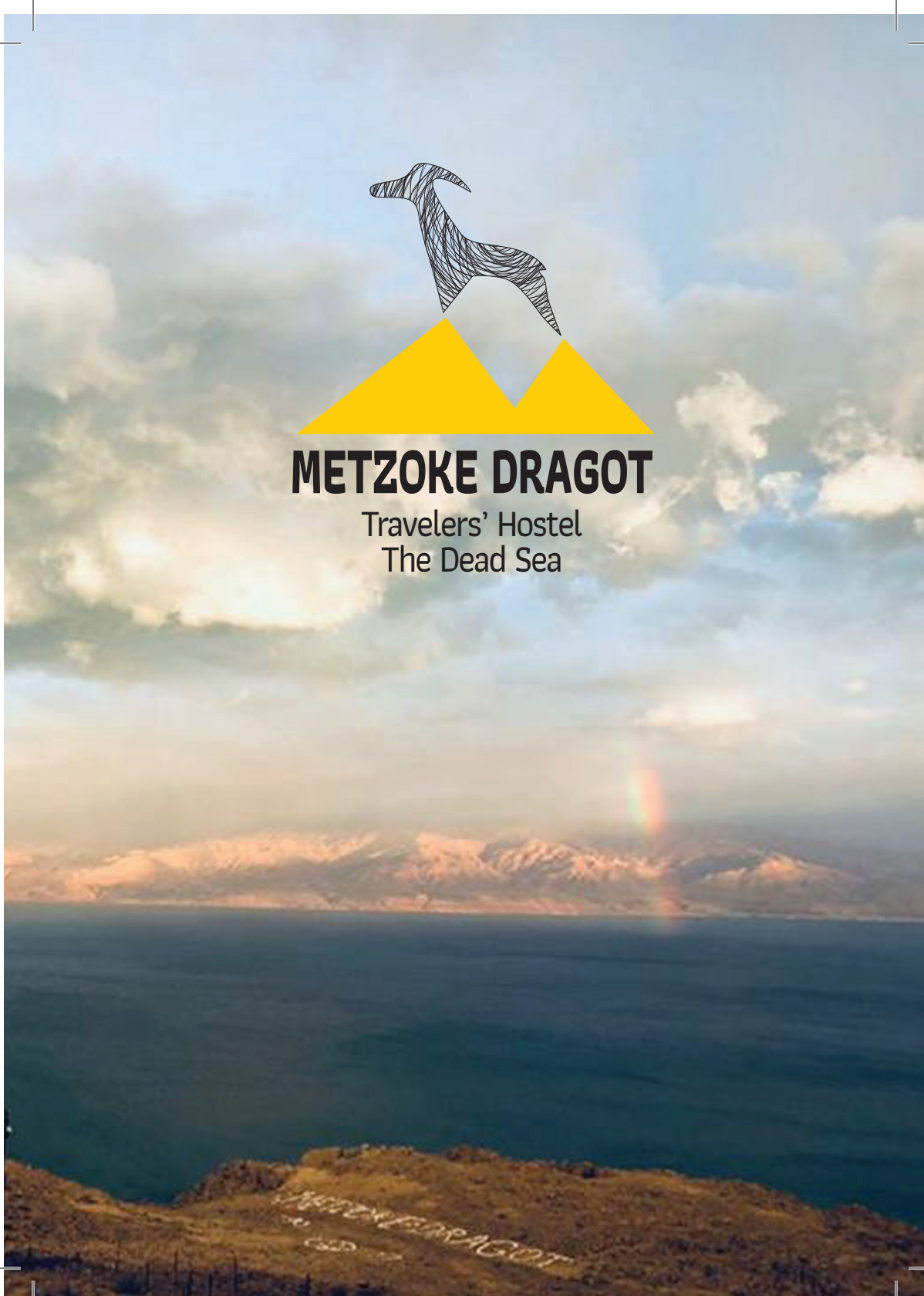

We offer our guest several accommodation options: basic rooms, campsites, desert and Bedouin tents, and open huts with straw roofs.

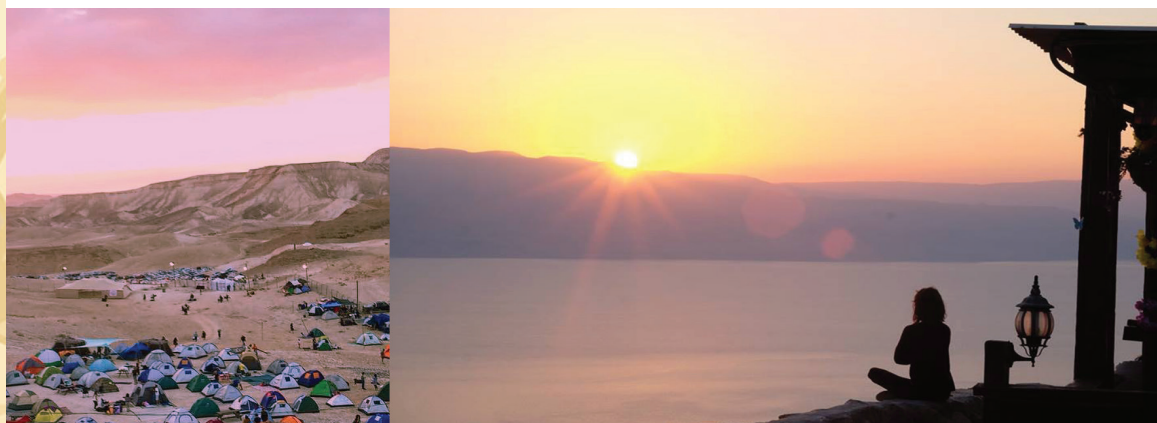


Metzoke Dragot is also the perfect venue for weddings, corporate events, festivals, conferences and other functions.

Nahal Mashash



-  **Suitable for:** 13 years and up
-  **Length:** 6 km total [4 miles; half on a dirt road]
-  **Best season:** year-round, unless there are flood warnings or extreme temperatures
-  **Map:** trail map no. 8 – Northern Judean Desert and the Dead Sea
-  **Water:** 3 liters per person

Park your vehicle at the holiday village and walk on the dirt road approximately 1.5 km [1 mile], to the start of the trail.

Description: After walking 1.5 km [1 mile] west of Metzoke Dragot following the dirt road, turn south towards a black trail marker. Follow the trail marker and begin to descend towards Upper Nahal Darga.

The descent is steep, and not all areas have handrails. After the descent, the road continues westward, not along the stream itself but on the northern ridge. The trail here is narrow; please be careful. Near the beginning of this trail is a turn towards a trail marker with two white stripes and a sign pointing to Murabat Caves. According to archeological findings, these caves may have been a hiding place for rebels during the Bar Kochba revolt.




Both the ascent and descent at the white trail marker are from the same trail. It is a very steep incline of several hundred meters. You do not have to follow the white trail marker towards the cave, and may choose to continue with the black trail marker. After walking for 30 minutes, the narrow trail comes to an end and you will reach a fork [the Pentagon]. Head right and upwards [northwest] with the red trail marker – Nahal Mashash.

The stream begins with two consecutive waterfalls – the first climbs left, with metal pegs and bars for support. The second one is bypassed on the right. Following the falls, you will reach some alluvium soil. When you see the beginning of a wall, look out for the trail marker on your left above the stream level, on the southern bank. Next, you will arrive at some boulders, after which lies a detour on the right. Follow it upwards and forward. Continue along the stream through the canyon. Approximately 20 m [72 ft] later you will find an exit point from the stream, to your left. Head up and out of the stream, and continue right where you will reach the main dirt road [green trail marker].

Important: Please bear in mind that the trail passes through a nature reserve. Do not leave the marked trail. You must leave the reserve before nightfall. It is important to pay attention to the color of the trail marker you decided to follow, as several trails merge here. Trail description courtesy of Ein Gedi Field School.

Qumran National Park [20 minutes' drive north]

Excavations revealed ancient structures which were reconstructed, bringing back to life the unique character and buildings of this settlement. The nearby Qumran wadi is the location of the hideaway caves in which the Dead Sea Scrolls were found.

Guided lantern tours are held on nights when there is a full moon.

On site: audiovisual presentation depicting the life of the Judean Desert Sect, a spacious visitor center, souvenir shop and restaurant.

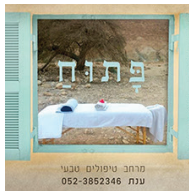

This magical nature reserve at the lowest place in the world is rich with natural spring-water wading pools, picnic sites and a Hidden Reserve where you can enjoy guided tours [by prior arrangement]. Join the bird ringing by prior arrangement. The site is home to archeological ruins, proof of a Jewish settlement in the area during the Second Temple era, including a factory that seems to have been used for the manufacturing of Balsamon perfume.

Bicycle trail for families and independent travelers

[25 minutes' drive north]



Park at Almog junction [restrooms and a café]. Ride your bicycle toward Kibbutz Almog [south, red trail marker on the map].

Before the bend to the right, merge with the road running along the right edge of the perimeter fence of the kibbutz, and pedal up a wide dirt road. The road is mainly downhill, with some challenging bends. At the end of the road you will reach a dirt hill. Keep left until you reach a dirt road ascending to the top of the hill, until you reach Og 2 reservoir [5 km, 3 miles] – a recycled waste-water reservoir used to irrigate the region's agricultural lands, the true realization of the “blooming of the desert” vision, turning arid salt-lands into an oasis with rich agriculture, most of which is cultivated for export to Europe.

After a short rest atop the hill, head down on the same path and merge right onto an asphalt road. Along the way you will see many crops, such as guava, onion, watermelon and pomegranate. Continue for another 3 kilometers [2 miles], just before route 1, and choose one of two options:

1. Right – 1.5 km [1 mile]. Peddle down the moderate descent towards Lido junction. Here you will find a gas station and café overlooking the Dead Sea, camelback rides, restrooms and an audio information station with facts about the region.
2. Left – heading back to the parking [blue trail marker, 6 km or 3.7 miles, this is a challenging ride, fit for ages 13 and up] towards Og 1 reservoir. Pass to the right of the reservoir and continue west on a wide dirt road with multiple ascents and descents. You will exit near Beit HaAravah junction by the road, passing through the agricultural lands of Kibbutz Almog towards Almog junction, which is visible in the distance.

Nahal Og [25 minutes' drive north]



-  **Suitable for:** fit walkers
-  **Length:** 2.7 km [1.7 miles]
-  **Duration:** approximately 2 hours
-  **Best season:** year-round, unless there are flood warnings
-  **Map:** trail map no. 8-Northern Judean Desert and the Dead Sea
-  **Water:** 3 liters per person
-  **Start and finish point:** near Kibbutz Almog








Follow the dirt road [red trail marker] into the gorge. At the bottom, turn right at the green trail marker, and begin walking upstream. The first third of the trail includes climbing two high waterfalls, one after the other [support handles are embedded in the rock]. As the channel begins to open up, you will reach a dirt road with a black trail marker that crosses the stream. Turn right and follow the road out of the stream [black trail marker, sign directing to Almog]. Walk another 100 m [110 yards] north on the road, and turn right at the blue trail marker to arrive back at the parking lot.

Important notes: The trail is not difficult to walk, but does include climbing several waterfalls, two of which are particularly high and long. Support handles are embedded in the rock for easier climbing. The trail is therefore not suitable for persons suffering from fear of heights. Please bear in mind that the trail passes through a nature reserve. Do not leave the marked trail. You must leave the reserve before nightfall.

Nahal Salvadora [15 minutes' drive south]



-  **Suitable for:** families
-  **Length:** 2 km [1.2 miles]
-  **Duration:** 2-3 hours
-  **Best season:** year round
-  **Map:** trail map no. 8 – Northern Judean Desert and the Dead Sea
-  **Water:** 2 liters per person, no sources of water on the trail
-  **Start and finish point:** Dead Sea Road [route 90] between Ein Gedi and Mitzpe Shalem

Description: Park your vehicle in the gravel parking lot, near the marking for kilometer 251 of the Dead Sea route, south of Mitzpe Shalom – you will recognize the location by the stream crossing the road. Carefully walk down east of the road to the mouth of the stream, passing through a constructed underground pass beneath the road, into the gorge. Salvadora stream, near the road and to its west, is a relatively narrow crevice created by the stream's erosion of the hard rock bank. The crevice has two dry falls, towering at 5 and 6 meters. The first of these has support handles, and the other a steep incline. After several meters, the stream expands to reveal giant boulders and rich flora. Proceed among the boulders along the green trail marker until you reach another small fall. You will climb this without the help of support handles. Continue following the green trail marker until you reach a rock plateau embedded with multiple fossils, and a fork with a blue trail marker. To see the spring, continue on the green trail climbing up towards the big waterfall, on the south bank. Upstream you will see a large, lush bush, behind which lies the spring. This bubbling spring attracts many animals: ibexes, hyraxes, rodents, snakes, birds, leopards and more. To return to your vehicle, go back to the fork with the blue trail marker and follow the blue trail out of the stream, enjoying the mesmerizing views of the Moab Mountains at dusk.

Ein Gedi nature reserve, Nahal David and Nahal Arugot

[20 minutes' drive south]

Given the uniqueness and importance of Ein Gedi nature reserve, an oasis at the Dead Sea, there is an entry fee and set opening hours, so that the local animals are able to enjoy their natural habitat. A visit to Ein Gedi is a must for nature lovers.

Ein Gedi reserve has two main entrances: Nahal David and Nahal Arugot, both accessible from the same turn off route 90. Nahal David is nearest to the road.

Several recommended trails:

Nahal David and Shulamit Fall – easy; Nahal Arugot – moderate; Nahal David through the Chalcolithic temple towards Ein Gedi and Tel Goren – moderate; Nahal David to Nahal Arugot – very challenging.

On an isolated bluff in the heart of the desert, overlooking the Dead Sea and the wilderness of the Judean Desert, there once stood a magnificent palace. During the Great Revolt, the last of the rebels fighting the Romans made this their stronghold, turning their desperate last stand into a symbol of the fight for freedom. The historic events that took place on the mountain and the archeological findings upon it, have resulted in Masada being granted UNESCO World Heritage Site status.

The Serpent Path is open for visitors daily, from one hour before sunrise. Approach from route 90. Duration to the top: approximately 1 hour. Level of difficulty: challenging.

The Roman Ramp Path is open for visitors daily, from half an hour before sunrise. Approach from Arad. Duration to the top: approximately half an hour. Level of difficulty: moderate.

Take part in a simple yet powerful desert experience, a break from daily life and a reminder of the simplicity of childhood.

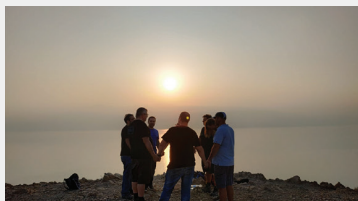
Come and join us in the desert!
